Why have a Funeral?

Funerals have been around for thousands of years and there is a reason why. They help us to understand, farewell, celebrate and support each other.

We understand today that death is an inevitable part of life and throughout our life's journey, saying goodbye to people we love is part of our living experience.

Across time societies have found special and significant ways to say goodbye. The myriad of ways reflect our culture, family, history and experiences. Yet even amidst cultural, ethnic, religious or social differences, a funeral meets four common human needs:

To understand: *When a life has ended funerals offer a finality and an understanding that we need to have the physical farewell to accept the reality of death and to work through our responses to loss. Avoiding this physical goodbye doesn't ease the sadness or stop those feelings of grief.*

To farewell: *We need time to mourn the loss of a loved one and the physical goodbye is just the beginning. We also need to share and release our emotions and feelings, and to pay tribute. The funeral provides an outlet for our emotional responses.*

To celebrate: *Funerals allow us to remember and celebrate someone's life. They can help meet our spiritual needs and provide a chance to honour and reflect on the unique life that was lived, in a meaningful way to them.*

It's a chance to share the story of the person who died and acknowledge their contribution to the lives of others.

To support: *Whatever the style or size of a funeral it is the shared act of coming together that provides the opportunity for support and comfort for those left behind - family, friends, workmates and acquaintances. Having a funeral is not a 'fuss', it is an important, shared experience. It is in the sharing of this goodbye that we can allow those who know us to show that our life has mattered to them.*



What happens now?

We understand that for many people arranging a funeral is a new or unfamiliar experience and while you may feel unsure about what to do next, we are here to help you. Take your time to read through this booklet before we meet with you so that you will know what will be discussed at the time of the arrangement.

It takes *coordination* and *time* to arrange a funeral. Even when a 'simple' service is requested, we need to meet with you and spend time with you discussing your options. These important decisions should never be rushed.

We are here to help you to create a memorable and personal tribute for your special person. Each funeral is unique and we can assist you with ideas and suggestions to add your personal touches.

In our care – transferring your loved one into our care

Our first contact with you is often when we are organising the transfer of your loved one into our care. Our staff will organise for the initial transfer from the place where your loved one has died, to our mortuary care centre at our Kyneton Chapel.

Our staff will guide you through this important step to organise the careful and sensitive transfer of your loved one, whether from a family home, hospital or other health care setting or the Coroners Court. We will liaise with the doctor or the Coroners Court (whichever is applicable) to arrange the necessary certificates or authorisations.



Property

When we are attending to the transfer we will complete our Authorisation, which lists all property with your loved one when transferred into our care, including things like clothing and personal effects.

Clothing & Mementos

When we meet with you to arrange the funeral you may like to bring in clothing for your loved one to be dressed. Special mementos, photos and personal effects may also be placed with them, which you can give to us at your appointment, or at a later time.

Viewings & spending time with your loved one

Once we have met with you and received the clothing, we can then organise for the preparation of your loved one to be completed. Everyone in our care is fully prepared by our experienced staff and this care and dignity is our highest priority at all times.

Choosing to spend time with your loved one is your decision and we want to provide the opportunity for every family to have that choice.

Sometimes having some quiet moments before the day of the funeral gives the family the opportunity to have time together, share some private thoughts and reflections, and it can be important in realising the reality of the death.

Having a private viewing prior to the day of the funeral itself can be more beneficial so that you have plenty of time and don't feel rushed.

Have you thought about having your loved one at home prior to the funeral? We can help you with any personal wishes you may have in the preparation of your loved one and in spending time with them. Please speak with your funeral consultant about your options.



Planning the Funeral

One of our helpful and experienced *Funeral Consultants* can meet with you at our Kyneton, Gisborne or Kilmore locations or at the family home if you prefer, to discuss the funeral arrangements.

We will discuss where the gathering will be held (the place of the funeral) as well as the place of burial or cremation. We will discuss the many options available to you including the coffin and casket choices, the celebrant if you would like one, newspaper insertions, flowers, music, audio visual presentations, mementos and refreshments, to ensure that the funeral is unique for your loved one.

We will also complete necessary paperwork required by law, such as burial or cremation forms and death registration and there will be some personal information we need from you to complete these.

Meeting with your Funeral Arranger

Arranging a funeral takes time so we allow between one and three hours to meet with you initially to have a discussion and provide some ideas and options.

You may find it helpful to read through this booklet before that first meeting, so you will be prepared for some of the information we require when we meet with you.

Your personal funeral consultant follows through on all your requests and, with the support of our team here at T. J. Scott and Son, we organise your wishes to be carried out.



Organising the Day and Time of the Funeral

Organising the day and time of the funeral requires the coordination of everyone involved to be available at the appointed time. Our first priority is ensuring that we can meet your expectations and provide a service or gathering that is not rushed. It's so much more than having a hearse present. We must ensure we have the experienced staff you need, together with the vehicles and equipment that are required.

Many people don't realise but we need to arrive at the place of the funeral at least an hour before the service starts, sometimes more, in order to have everything ready at that appointed time. This is why we recommend our preferred times of **10.30am** or **2.30pm**.

This means we can meet your needs and not compromise our service standards by scheduling funerals too close together.

We must firstly coordinate staff availability, vehicles required, equipment needed, in conjunction with the celebrant, the venue, cemetery and crematorium, caterers and many other suppliers and we need time to liaise and co-ordinate all your preferences for you. Once you have met with your personal consultant, they will discuss your needs with our funeral coordinator and then confirm with you the options available.

We provide flexible, time-based service options on the day to ensure everything runs at a pace that suits you.

Our *Premium* Service Fee gives you the whole day, so timing is far more flexible for those families who need it, plus we ensure 3-5 staff are available to fulfill every request.

Please look through the funeral format suggestions so you are aware of the service options you can choose and select the one that best suits your needs.



Funeral Choices

We always recommend to *'give yourself time'*.

The first thing to remember when organising a funeral is that it does take time. You may feel that it would be easier to have the funeral behind you as quickly as possible but in our experience, we see that taking your time helps you in the days ahead.

It's also important to consider things such as relatives who may need to travel, having time to spend with your loved one, preparing important components such as writing the eulogy, selecting photos and putting together a slideshow and other special touches you may like to help prepare.

Funeral Formats

There are many ways a funeral can be organised and there are various options available to you, to suit your family and reflect the life of the person. Any of these options can be public or private.

Some of the most requested formats for a funeral include:

- A service held (at your choice of venue) followed immediately by a cortege to the place of burial or cremation where a committal will take place.
- A service held (at your choice of venue) which is followed by a committal at the cemetery or crematorium (which may be attended by immediate family only (not advertised/private)).



- A service held (at your choice of venue) with no cortege to follow. The coffin is placed in the hearse and only the funeral directors attend the committal.
- A service and committal held at our funeral chapel and the coffin remains in the chapel.
- A Committal Service / Gathering held at the graveside or crematorium chapel only.
- A Memorial Service (A Celebration of Life) is held, where the coffin or casket is not present.

A Memorial Service or Celebration of Life usually follows a non-attended burial or cremation. This is often chosen when the deceased has requested that 'nothing' be held. It gives the option of having something private being the burial or cremation (and in keeping with the person's wish) but also provides an important opportunity for those left behind to say farewell, to share their loss and offer support. We can help organise all of this for you.

Service Options to consider

Our '*Premium Option*' can help make a very detailed service so much easier.

We provide additional staff in order to help set-up the venue and provide the additional services required such as carrying and lowering the coffin. It means you have up to 5 people for the entire day and this is often needed especially when a funeral is going to be particularly large (over 150 people).

When you would prefer some time between when the service takes place and before the burial or cremation is held, we offer the '*Extended Service Option*' to ensure you have the time you need.

Sometimes families prefer to share refreshments with family and friends before their private committal service. The burial or cremation can then be held later the same day or on the following day/s, when the cemetery or crematorium are available.

Did you know that funerals can be held at *twilight* or in the evening at certain venues? Or maybe a Saturday suits your family better?

Our '*After Hours*' Option takes into consideration the need for services and gatherings outside the 'normal hours'. If the burial or cremation is unable to be held the same day the 'Extended Fee' ensures we allow 2 days when needed.

Remember that there is no 'right' way to have a funeral so please speak with your funeral consultant about any ideas you may have.



One of the first decisions to make is choosing the place to have a service or gathering. This may be influenced by the person's cultural or religious background, a previous experience or the person's interests or personality. We have organised funerals in so many different venues, from a shearing shed to Hanging Rock and from football ovals to a yacht club – the list is endless.

Possible venues include:

- The Thomas J Scott Memorial Chapel
- A crematorium chapel
- A church or sacred space
- At the graveside
- A private residence or property
- A garden, riverbank or other outdoor setting
- A school hall or civic venue
- A sporting or recreation club
- At a favourite hotel or reception venue
- A winery, or an historic property
- A theatre or community hall

Burial or Cremation?

We can organise a burial at a cemetery or a cremation at the crematorium of your choice. Every cemetery and crematorium have different fees and options available, and we can find out those options for you once you have decided on your preferred place. We have organised burials all over Victoria and interstate.

Cremation

Cremations in Victoria can be held at Fawkner, Altona, Springvale, Lilydale, Bunurong, Bendigo, Ballarat or Geelong. If you choose cremation, we personally attend to the cremation at your chosen crematorium and we do not use private cremators interstate.



Cremated Remains

You can choose to collect the cremated remains from the crematorium yourself or we can collect these personally on our next visit. Once you have collected the cremated remains you may wish to:

- Select a special urn for the ashes to be kept at home.
- Memorialise the ashes at your home or on a property.
- Memorialise the ashes at a cemetery or memorial garden (Memorial wall or rose garden or family grave).
- Scatter the ashes at a significant place using one of our special scattering tubes.
- We also have keepsake urns for a small portion of ashes to be kept in.
- Small amounts of cremated remains can be placed in keepsake jewellery.



Burial

When choosing a burial, it is important to know the options at each cemetery, as some cemeteries may have both lawn and monumental areas to choose from and offer different types of monuments or plaques. Some cemeteries allow you to select your preferred grave so you may need to take some time to visit your chosen cemetery and see what is available. It is also important to think about purchasing additional cemetery plots if other family members wish to be buried alongside your loved one. If you have pre-purchased a cemetery plot or it is to be a re-opened grave please bring along the details of the grave.



Additional Options

Celebrant

A celebrant is the person chosen by you to lead the service or gathering. They put the content of the service together and work with you to organise the words that are spoken, the music that is played, any other elements of the service and in what order the service will be. It is important the celebrant you choose helps reflect the life of your loved one in a way that is meaningful to them.

You may be affiliated with a church or group with whom a clergy or minister may take part, it may be a funeral celebrant or an experienced MC you know personally. We also have our very own experienced funeral celebrants in John Scott and Kelly Scott, who understand how important sharing a meaningful and appropriate service is. The choice is yours.



Music

Music is such an important part of any goodbye. It can convey your feelings, it can reflect the person's interests and it can evoke memories and experiences shared. We not only have an extensive music library and will source recorded music for you, but we can organise live musicians and/or singers if that is your preference.

Tributes and other Online Notifications

We offer all families a beautiful Tribute page for your loved one at no charge, providing a special place to share your thoughts and memories, favourite photos and messages, details about the funeral and any special requests for the service. Even when a funeral is private you can still have a Tribute page to share special memories.



Notices

Many people nominate a newspaper for a death and funeral notice to be inserted and we can organise these for you in any publication of your choosing. If you need help and guidance in putting these together talk to your funeral consultant. (See page 30-33 for some suggestions)

Flowers

What you place on the coffin, around the coffin or in the venue is of your choosing. If you would like us to order any flowers on your behalf, please discuss with your funeral consultant about your personal preferences. You may prefer to supply or organise these yourself.

Don't forget little touches like single stem flowers, petals, sprigs of rosemary or lavender which we can organise for you as well.



Memorial Books

Memorial Books are often requested for funerals for those attending to sign as they are an important keepsake of who was able to share in the service. We have a selection of memorial books available, or you may wish to supply or make your own.

Why not provide a special book at the refreshments for people to share a favourite story a quotation or a message for the family? Invite guests to bring along a favourite photo to be added to the book. We have our 'Life Remembered' books for this purpose or supply your own.



Order of Service Programs

Order of service leaflets, church and mass booklets can be prepared either by the family or we can prepare and print these for you. We offer paper or card and 4 designs to choose from – Standard, Traditional, Cursive & Contemporary. Costs vary according to selections chosen, number of photos included and pages required.

Order of service leaflets not just provide an overview of the service they are a lovely keepsake for those attending. While people can share, we have found that, if possible, most people love to have their own copy to keep and you may even like to send copies to those unable to attend.

Visual Tributes

Visual Tributes (slideshow) are often included during a funeral or memorial service. They usually include 30-50 favourite photos prepared as a slideshow to music (usually 2 pieces of music-approx. 5-7 minutes).

We can organise a Visual Tribute specialist for you, to put together a beautiful tribute with your favourite photos to your special music selections.

Photo tributes take time to do professionally and at least 3 working days is required prior to the funeral for this to be put together. Your photos can be uploaded to the provider directly and they liaise with you to put together something special for your loved one. They will also send a proof through to you at least 2 days prior to ensure it is all correct.

Please speak with your Funeral Consultant if you have any questions. Please note that the cost of the visual tribute does not include any audio visual equipment hire that may be required at the venue.



Some families prefer to prepare the photo slideshow themselves and in this case we advise that they thoroughly test the presentation personally, at the venue, before the day of the service to ensure it will play without issue. Unfortunately, we have seen some families unable to play their beautiful slideshow because it was in the wrong format or not compatible with the equipment supplied. If supplied by family or friends it is their responsibility to organise this on the day of the service.

Live Streaming & Filming

If you would like the service or gathering filmed & live streamed we can organise experienced professionals to provide this service for you. Live-streaming has certainly been utilised extensively in recent years and it has been appreciated by family and friends who are unable to be there can be part of this important service – wherever they are!

Reserve Seating

If you would like to have some seating reserved for the immediate and extended family or friends at the service, please advise your funeral consultant how many seats you will require and we will organise some reserved signs to be placed at the venue. Please advise those with reserved seating to make their way to the reserved area.

Coffin Bearers

Please advise our staff who you have selected to carry / wheel the coffin/casket for the funeral service. You will need at least four people to be able to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the service so we can guide them in the procedure.



Family Vehicles

Additional vehicles to convey family and friends can be hired through chauffeur services if required. Please let us know if you would like us to book this service for you.

Funeral Cortege

When possible, the funeral cortege can be requested to drive past a special place on the way to the cemetery or crematorium.

Refreshments

Gathering together following the service is an important time and there are many options available to provide refreshments for this. You may prefer to host people in your own home (or with the help of a catering service) or share morning/afternoon tea, lunch or finger food at a local cafe, hall, meeting place, club, pub or other appropriate venue. We have a list of options available if you need guidance with this.

Donations

If you would prefer people make a donation in lieu of bringing flowers to the funeral please advise our staff which charity you would prefer and we can include this request in the funeral notice and/or on your Tribute page. Donations will then be made directly through the charity website. We do not accept donations at the funeral service as these should be made directly to the organisation selected.



Audio Visual Equipment:

Some venues have their own audio and visual equipment included. If not, we can help organise this for you. The equipment required will depend on what you need (microphone/s, PA, CD/audio player, laptop, projector, screens, TV's, speaker/s), how big the venue is and how many people might possibly attend.

For smaller venues and numbers, we can supply a simple PA, microphone, screen and projector for a minimal cost. In our experience, we would suggest professional AV equipment be sourced when it is a large venue or more than 100 people are expected. This ensures everyone can hear the service and music as well as any presentations which is so important for such an occasion.

Other Equipment Hire:

Whatever it is you need, we can help organise it for you. Marquees, heating, cooling, chairs, tables, stages, plants, decoration – just let us know and we can help put it together.



Making it Unique

There are so many options available to make a funeral service special, unique, and individual. We have collated many of the ideas we have organised for families but what you decide to do is only limited by your imagination. The main thing to keep in mind is creating a moment in time where this place and this gathering is all about your loved one and many of those special things don't cost a cent!

- ***Decorating/personalising the coffin or casket*** – Art stores have stencils and stickers available that can be added to the interior or exterior of the casket or perhaps design your own 'Your Story' Coffin with personal photos which are imaged-wrapped on the coffin for something completely unique.
- ***Use the space to reflect their life*** – Using flowers, plants, shrubs or balloons to decorate the venue, display favourite posters or art – whatever you can to make the space feel like theirs.
- ***Create a Memory Table*** – Display special items and keepsakes which reflect your loved ones, interests and passions (sporting items, craft/art/ photos/ favourite treats/ awards/ books). Place a Memory Board or a Quote Board nearby can also add that personal touch.
- ***Keepsakes*** – Sharing something special with those who attend is another special way of creating and keeping memories (e.g.: giving out seedlings or seeds to plant, postcards with favourite photos and sentiments, sharing favourite lollies or treats.) We have a lovely range of 'Memorial Seeds' to choose from which come with flower seeds and a sentiment card, that would make a lovely gift for guests.
- ***Wearing something significant*** – Ask guests to wear a particular colour or a certain item of clothing, like a hat, something with sparkles, a touch of colour.
- ***Releasing doves or butterflies*** – Balloons are an environmental hazard and are now banned from being released Australia wide, so release something natural.
- ***Involving Children & Young People*** – Placing special keepsakes or mementos such as letters, photos, drawings by children and grandchildren (which involves them in this important process) in or on the coffin.
- ***Lighting candles during the service*** – add a special/significant aroma.
- ***Toasting*** – with champagne or a favourite refreshment.



The cost of a funeral depends on the choices you make. Funeral prices range to suit budgets and preferences, which is why they can cost less than \$ 6,000 or more than \$20,000.

Organising a funeral requires time, knowledge and experience, even when the funeral itself is relatively simple. We provide you with funeral options, choices and time to make important decisions. It's our role to make it as easy as possible for you by sharing our expertise and getting things done. Most importantly we are here to care for your loved one and organise their burial or cremation. There's a lot of work behind the scenes to make that happen – to meet legal and regulatory requirements and book venues, musicians, equipment, cemetery and death notices – to name a few.

At T. J. Scott and Son, we know what to do. We help with the practical and necessary parts of organising a funeral plus we also take care of all the big and little things that make the difference, including professional assistance for photo presentations and funeral stationery. You can be as involved and 'hands on' as you want to be. We're here to organise the funeral that is meaningful for you, with all of the care, gentleness and understanding that people experiencing grief need to get them through their difficult time.

On the day of the funeral, it's our role to guide you through the service and check everything, to make sure things run smoothly. We check the grave prior to the service, where possible, we liaise with the clergy, musicians on arrival to ensure everyone knows what each other is doing and when. We explain procedures to the coffin bearers and to other family members or friends who have roles on the day. We also organise the audio and visual equipment to be managed on the day again to ensure these important components run smoothly.



What costs are included in the funeral expenses?

T.J. Scott and Son Funeral Directors provide a wide range of services and options to help make the funeral service as individual and personal as possible while offering choices to suit varying budgets.

Many people don't realise when they hear a figure for a funeral service that it often includes some of these third-party expenses that we organise on a family's behalf. It just makes it easier for many families when we organise everything for them, so that all of the funeral expenses are itemised on the one account.

So, the total cost really depends on what you choose and what you need us to do for you. We'll help you to make informed choices that work for you and your family.

There are 4 main elements of funeral expenses:

- The funeral directors professional service fee
- The coffin, casket or shroud selection
- The third-party fees (out of pocket expenses)
- The goods & services tax (GST)

Take your time to read through the description of the professional fees and what these include. Once you have decided on the funeral format that best suits your family, the coffin or casket selection and the other elements of the funeral, we will provide an itemised estimate of the funeral costs.

Range of Professional Services Options

Our range of professional service options include:

- Our Premium Option
- The Extended Option
- Our Standard Option

We also offer more simple choices which include:

- The Thomas J Scott Chapel Option
- The Committal Service (Arrival) Option
- Memorial Service (Celebration of Life)

Whilst we do have a basic 'no service' option available, many families prefer to have a non-attended burial or cremation which is then followed by a Memorial or Celebration, a formal or informal gathering of family and friends, which we help organise for them. We can then help you put that special gathering together and attend on the day to ensure everything runs smoothly.

Just because someone may have requested something simple or they have just said 'just have a party afterwards', doesn't mean you don't need the support and expertise in organising that very special goodbye too!

A funeral is not a 'fuss' and there are many ways to say goodbye and not all involve a formal service or gathering. Our basic care 'Direct Committal Option' includes that important opportunity to spend some time of farewell or quiet reflection at our chapel prior to the cremation taking place with a viewing or visitation.

We are here to help and guide you in any way we can so please speak with us about what you might need to do, in your way.



What does the Professional Service Fee include?

All Funeral Directors have a professional fee which includes various components of their service. All our *professional service fees* include the following as standard inclusions:

- Caring, experienced and professional staff to attend to you and your loved one, when you need it most. We provide a 24 hour a day roster so that families can contact us when they need to – at any time.
- The arranging and organising of the funeral. This takes many hours, with the utmost care and attention to detail to ensure everything is prepared as it should be for the day of the funeral. We offer options, guidance, and support and organise many additional services on your behalf.
- We include our comprehensive mortuary care and preparation of your loved one for burial or cremation. This is incredibly important and should never be ‘an optional extra’. Even if there is no viewing, everyone in our care is prepared as you would expect. You never know when someone may need this opportunity to say goodbye.
- Our dedicated team of mortuary care professionals are here to offer specialised care and attention to each individual entrusted to our care. This personalised approach can greatly enhance the time you spend with your cherished loved one. Feel free to reach out to us today to learn more about the benefits it can bring to your viewing experience.
- We offer private arrangement and consultation facilities in Kyneton, Gisborne and Kilmore for your convenience. This means you can come to us, at any time. To make sure we always have someone available for you please ring to make an appointment if you would like to come in and speak to a consultant.
- The transfer of your loved one into our care is included. If the transfer is required outside normal hours (M-F 9am-5pm) or outside of our usual operating area (Macedon Ranges Shire, Kilmore, Wallan & Broadford) an additional fee would be apply.
- We include the use of our hearse (*excludes Chapel Service Option and the Memorial Service Option where hearse is not required).



- We include the provision of viewing facilities during normal hours (Monday-Friday 9am -5pm) at our Kyneton Chapel.
- We organise for the procurement of all the necessary documentation and the lodgement of all official paperwork with the appropriate registrar.
- We prepare all the necessary documentation required for burial or cremation.
- Our beautiful online [Tribute](#) page is also included and this is dedicated to your loved one. You can share memories and stories and receive messages of condolence.
- We have staff attending to the memorial book (if requested) and warmly invite those attending to sign their name.
- We provide guidance for your chosen coffin bearers on the day of the funeral, so they know how to safely carry the coffin.
- We can provide a compilation of your chosen songs, using our extensive music library.
- We provide guidance and support whenever you need it. We can help you with putting together your service booklets, have reading suggestions, can offer guidance for service formats etc.
- Every professional fee and coffin price quoted to you already includes GST. It is not added on when the account is sent out to you. We make sure you are aware of all costs prior to the funeral so there are no 'surprises' If you are not sure about something please don't hesitate to ask.
- We organise and coordinate your chosen celebrant, the cemetery or crematorium, newspaper insertions, ordering of flowers and arrangements, music, printing, refreshments, equipment hire to name a few, from a range of trusted and preferred suppliers. Our professional fees include the time we take to organise these things on your behalf.

Coffins, Caskets and Environmental Options

T.J. Scott and Son offer a wide range of coffins and caskets which come in many different shapes, styles and colours. There are also custom made, hand-painted and environmental options. Coffins and caskets are made from particle board, custom wood, a number of solid timbers, as well as metal and must meet certain specifications by law. For more information you are invited to contact our office or to visit our website www.tjscottandson.com.au which features a selection of the coffins and caskets we have available.

Additional Items & Services

Additional items and services included in the out of pocket expenses are fees such as crematorium or cemetery fees, the celebrant or clergy fees, newspaper notices, flowers, venue hire, musicians, audio visual & equipment hire and catering and any number of other requests that may be made. There are many ways in which to personalise a funeral service and we offer an extensive range of options in addition to our professional service which are available on request for an additional fee.

Goods & Services Tax

The GST applies to most funeral and related costs that are part of the funeral expenses on the account. Some providers and suppliers are not registered for GST and if their fees are paid directly by you, you can save the GST component. Examples of GST exempt expenses are cemetery fees (for the purchase of the grave only), clergy fees, some musicians and celebrants.

Please let your funeral consultant know if you would prefer to pay GST exempt items yourself.



What payment is required before the Funeral?

To help ensure everything runs smoothly on the day of the funeral, we kindly ask that **full payment** of the funeral expenses is made **prior to the day of the service**.

This allows us to pay the many third-party costs we organise on your behalf—such as cemetery or crematorium fees, coffin or casket selection, celebrants, notices, flowers, catering, venue and equipment hire -which are often required in advance for the funeral to proceed as planned. By managing these on your behalf, we aim to reduce the burden of coordinating multiple payments during an already difficult time. Some third-party costs may initially be provided to you as estimates. Once confirmed, we will issue a detailed invoice with the most accurate and up-to-date figures. As long as the majority of costs are settled, any small final additions or adjustments can be invoiced separately after the service.

The person who signs the **Funeral Service Agreement** is responsible for payment of the funeral expenses.

The **administration fee of \$300** (which covers the cost of recovering late payments) will be **waived** if the account is paid in full by the day of the funeral.

Please note that payment of funeral expenses is not subject to Insurance claims, Workcover claims, Superannuation payments or the settlement of estates.



What Personal Information is needed to arrange a Funeral?

Part of our role as funeral directors is to complete the necessary legislative and regulatory requirements for the Registration of Death and the Authorisations for Burial or Cremation to take place.

When a person has died, their death is registered with the Department of Births Deaths and Marriages in the Australian State or Territory the death has occurred.

We complete this registration once the funeral has taken place and, together with the Medical Certificate or Coroners Report, the Death Certificate is then issued.

The Death Certificate is sent by post to the person nominated, usually the senior next of kin. We submit the personal details as given to us however if there are any changes or alterations to be made once the details have been submitted the original you receive must be returned to the Registry together with a letter requesting the change to be made and they will re-issue the certificate.

Please allow up to 4 weeks, after the day of the funeral, for the Death Certificate to be sent to you. If your loved one was in the care of the Coroners Court, the death registration will take longer as the coroner's findings must be completed. (Possibly 8-12 weeks) Please let us know if there are any delays beyond this time as we offer to follow this up for you with the Registry on your behalf.

On the following page is a list of all the personal information required for the Death Registration to be completed. It may help you to look over this list and complete the details you do know, as you may need to check some details with birth or marriage certificates prior to meeting with us.

Newspaper Notices

T.J. Scott and Son can place your death and funeral notices on your behalf in any newspaper in Australia. Newspaper notices not only give public notification of the death and funeral details, but also provide a way for you to express your loss, thank those who have supported you and nominate special requests for the funeral itself.

A Death Notice

A death notice publically advises that a person has died and often includes details of their family and other personal messages. Death notices can be as simple or as detailed as you wish. It may just include basic information such as the name of your loved one, the dates of their birth and death, and the details of the immediate family members. Or you may like to include a poem or verse or some special memories of your loved one, symbols, borders or even a photograph. Your funeral consultant can assist you with this and find out the costs.

It can be formal or informal, standard or more personalised – it's up to you. Please see pages 32-33 for some suggested sentiments.



A funeral notice publicly advises the funeral details including the date, time and place of the funeral. The funeral director's details are placed at the bottom of the notice to refer all enquiries about the funeral through them, rather than having to contact the family directly.

When a funeral is private you have the choice to announce the private funeral in a funeral notice (E.g.: 'The private family funeral for Caroline was held on July 10th 2018, in accordance with her wishes') or add to the family death notice (E.g.: 'It was Caroline's wish that a private funeral be held') so those who know your loved one are aware of the circumstances. Whilst this notice needs to have all the important information, it may be personalised and worded to your preference. This is the place to advise people of any special requests, such as donations to a charity, any instructions regarding flowers, requests as to any particular attire to be worn by mourners, etc. Your funeral consultant will assist you in writing the funeral announcement.

Funeral services can be held just about anywhere (with permission) and more and more people are thinking about special places of significance such as a beach, park or restful place to represent an aspect of someone's life.

By choosing a venue where you don't need electricity, heating or cooling such as an outdoor venue, you have also made a contribution to reducing carbon emissions.

Coffins, Caskets and Shrouds

Due to demand and as community interest grows, more 'green' choices are being developed to offer coffins, caskets and shrouds that are more sustainable. Our website tjscottandson.com.au has our full range of coffins and caskets. Please speak to our caring staff about all your options.

Flowers

Speak with your florist about ideas that help convey a sense of continuity, with the flowers you choose for the coffin or to 'green' the venue. Locally grown flowers and plants which are potted and not cut is another 'greener' option.



Tributes

Print media makes a huge environmental impact, so our beautiful online Tributes, not only provides an online announcement of the funeral details, it is a personalised tribute to your loved one. Your Tribute page allows family and friends to share photos, send messages and share their thoughts and memories, as well as include digital versions of the funeral service leaflets. We can even have the visual tribute (slideshow) added after the service.

Funeral Service Leaflets and Stationery

Order of service leaflets are an often requested service and a personal memento for attendees to take with them. Using recycled paper and printing supplies and sending e-versions to long-distance family and friends reduces their impact.

Refreshments

The special gathering held after the service is another opportunity to create less environmental impact but of a personal one in the way you decorate, cater and gather together.

Balloons

Using biodegradable latex balloons is a colourful option to decorate your chosen venue – selecting favourite colours adds a personal touch. (Biodegradable balloons can also be composted after use!)

Carbon-offsetting

Imagine the difference you could make by highlighting the benefit of, and encouraging those who are attending a funeral service, to contribute to a carbon-offset program in memory. You could also nominate a land-care group or other environmental cause to receive donations in lieu of flowers.



Before the Day of the Funeral

For many families arranging and organising a funeral is a new experience. Whilst you may have attended funeral services before now, this may be the first time you have had to be personally involved in the organisation and planning of a funeral.

With all the decisions involved when arranging a funeral, it can be difficult to remember all the little details on the day itself.

Between the time of arranging the funeral and the day of the service there are usually quite a few things to be finalised.

Here is a checklist of the things you may need to finalise before the day of the service.

Framed photo

In addition to the photos, you may provide for the order of service programs, you may also like to have a framed photo placed on the coffin for the service.

We have a selection of simple A4 and collage frames available and can print your favourite photo to size for a minimal cost.

Music

Have you selected the music for the service?

We can compile a playlist on a USB with all of the music for the service, in the order it is to be played. We check the playlist prior to the service because it's those little things that can make all the difference.

Please confirm your music selections to us at least 24 hours before the service. If you have a particular version, please drop in your CD or email the music file to us for us to check.



Visual Tribute

If you are preparing a visual tribute (slideshow) yourself, please make sure it is in a format compatible with the equipment it will be played on and that it is tested on that equipment before the day of the funeral. Remember just because it plays on your equipment at home or on your laptop doesn't mean it will with other equipment.

Reserved Seating

Please confirm closer to the day what seating you need reserved for the immediate family and/or extended family and friends, and we will organise to place 'reserved' signs at the venue. Please advise your family and friends if they are to be seated in these seats.

Coffin Bearers

Please remind your coffin bearers to be at the funeral at least 15 minutes before the service as we need to meet with all of them together to explain the procedure.

Being a coffin bearer is considered an honour however it's not only a physical task but an emotional one as well. Please select your coffin bearers with care. We will guide them as much as possible, but they are responsible for their own health and safety, and if they have any doubt about their ability to carry and/or lower the coffin they should ask someone to stand in on their behalf.

Payment of Funeral Expenses

To help ensure that everything runs smoothly on the day of the funeral, we kindly ask that payment of the funeral expenses be made *prior to the day of the service*.

Many of the costs associated with a funeral—such as cemetery or crematorium fees, clergy or celebrant fees, newspaper notices, flowers, and venue hire—are paid to third parties on your behalf.



These payments are often required in advance for the funeral to proceed as planned.

Some third-party costs may initially be provided to you as estimates. Once these are confirmed, we will issue a detailed invoice that reflects the most accurate and up-to-date amounts. As long as the majority of the funeral expenses have been paid, any final additions or adjustments can be invoiced separately after the service.

We understand that this is a difficult time, and we are here to guide and support you through every step of the process.

On the Day of the Funeral

Here are a few questions commonly asked about the day of the funeral.

If there is anything you are unsure of or need to confirm please do not hesitate to ask – that's what we are here for.

What time should I arrive?

We recommend arriving at least 30 minutes before the start of the service, or you can arrive earlier if you would like to greet those attending as they arrive.

When should I take my seat?

Some people like to be seated early just to have a few moments before the funeral begins and some families prefer to walk in together just before the service commences – it's up to you. If unsure, just speak with your funeral consultant and we can escort you to your seat when you are ready.

How will the coffin bearers know what to do?

Please ask the coffin bearers to arrive at least 15 minutes before the service so we can speak with them as a group, explain their role, and guide them in carrying and, if needed, lowering the coffin safely.



What happens when the service is over?

If the coffin is to be carried to the hearse:

At the end of the service, we'll move to the coffin during the final song. Sometimes it needs to be adjusted before being carried or wheeled out. When ready, we'll quietly invite the nominated coffin bearers forward and guide them through the process. The family then follows behind the coffin, unless they prefer to remain in the venue.

If the coffin is remaining in the venue:

If the coffin is staying in place, our staff or the celebrant will come to the family toward the end of the final song to gently guide you out. If you prefer a more relaxed exit, you're welcome to leave when you're ready.

If proceeding to the cemetery or crematorium:

Once the coffin is placed in the hearse, you'll have a few minutes to speak with guests. The conductor will then let everyone know when the hearse is departing. It's customary for the immediate family to follow, and for cars in the procession to travel with headlights on.

What happens to the flowers on the coffin?

Usually, the arrangement on the coffin remains with the coffin for burial or cremation, unless otherwise instructed. Other floral tributes are usually placed on the grave or taken to the crematorium, however, please tell us if you would prefer otherwise. We will collect the cards from the floral tributes and give them to the family.

What happens at the Cemetery?

We will, whenever possible, check the prepared grave and dress it for burial, prior to the funeral service commencing. We take this opportunity to check around the grave for possible hazards and will let you know if we feel the area may be unsafe.

At the graveside, we will talk to the coffin bearers and guide them through the carrying and lowering process.



The family will usually stand together, close to the graveside, during the committal service. At the end of the service, the family will be invited to come forward and place petals or flowers into the grave, followed by other mourners.

If you would like a small or large basket of petals or perhaps sprigs of lavender or rosemary, evergreens or single stems of a favourite flower please let your funeral arranger know and we can order these for you.

Alternatively you might have some lovely colour, greenery or sprigs in your own garden you can bring along for this.

What happens at the Crematorium Chapel?

If you would like to have a committal service at the crematorium, we will book a chapel at a suitable time for you. When we arrive, we'll briefly stop at the crematorium office to submit the required paperwork before heading to the chapel.

If you'd like the coffin to be carried into the chapel, we will park at the front entrance and guide the bearers from the hearse. If not, we can take the coffin to the rear entrance and place it gently on the catafalque, while the family gathers at the front doors. Once everything is ready, we'll invite everyone in to take their seats.

At the end of the service, the celebrant will indicate to the crematorium staff when the coffin is to be lowered. If you would prefer the coffin not be lowered during the service, please let your funeral consultant or celebrant know beforehand.

Many crematorium chapels also offer video recording. If you would like the committal to be filmed, please let us know as early as possible so we can arrange it—additional charges may apply.

Most importantly, we want you to feel comfortable with every part of the day. If you have any questions—big or small—please don't hesitate to speak with your funeral consultant.
